Was it to celebrate a person, a place, time or event? Have you written with respect for yourself and others? Repeat the process, condensing until your speech fits just under your time allocation. In your mind choose a child to address your speech to. You want them to forget they're hungry or that their chair is hard or that their bills need paying. What kind of speech are you giving? Informing or persuading your parents or teachers is going to be far different than informing your peers, or an audience of kindergarteners. Try to include narratives that people will identify with. Your task is work out what the specific hook is to catch your audience. If you're not a teacher you may not understand the phrase. It lets them know you understand them too. They can also involve trying to get people to engage in certain behaviors. Keep the formal part of your speech brief. Before you start writing you need to know: WHO you are writing your speech for the audience and WHY WHAT your speech is going to be about its topic - You'll want to have thought through your main points and have ranked them in order of importance. It can be important to have this clarified when getting an assignment to write and give a speech. Ask also: How long you're expected to speak for What the purpose is behind inviting you to speak If the group has members with special needs you should be aware of like children who are deaf, sight impaired or emotionally fragile Once you've got that information you're ready to begin shaping your material.
